## **Panel: Equity, Diversity and Inclusion: Nurse Leaders Moving into the Future of Nursing**

**Moderator and Facilitator: Susan Apold, PhD, RN, ANP-BC, FAAN, FAANP** Dr. Apold, an Alum of the RWJF ENF 2013 cohort is Dean and Professor of the School of Nursing at the College of Mount Saint Vincent in the Bronx, NY. Prior to her work at the College of Mount Saint Vincent, Dr. Apold was the Founding Dean of two Baccalaureate programs and one Graduate program in Westchester County New York. Dr. Apold also served as President of the American Association of Nurse Practitioners and facilitated the merger of two national NP organizations into one unified Association.

**June Chan, MS, MHA, RN (Panelist):** Ms. Chan is a senior health care administrator with over 20 years of strategic business leadership and development experience in health care. Ms. Chan is a visionary and nursing leader and influencer. She has worked with major healthcare systems to expand programs, services and specialty clinics for children with complex medical needs. June recently retired from the University of California San Francisco Benioff Children's Hospital as Director of Nursing Practice, Patient Experience and Affiliate Hospitals. President/CEO of June SL Chan Healthcare Consulting, June has been the recipient of the Colorado Excellence in Nursing Leadership Award, the Colorado Nightingale Award and the Colorado Springs Business Journal Women of Influence Award.

**Regina Cunningham, PhD, RN (Panelist):** Dr. Cunningham is the Chief Executive Officer of the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania and Adjunct Professor and Assistant Dean for Clinical Practice at the University of Pennsylvania School of Nursing. Dr. Cunningham is an accomplished executive, scientist and educator who has made impactful contributions to advancing nursing practice and clinical care. Most recently, she served as a member of the National Academy of Medicine Committee that developed the recent report *The Future of Nursing 2020—2030 Charting a Path to Achieve Health Equity*.

**Donna Thompson, MS, RN, (Panelist):** is Chief Executive Officer of ACCESS Community Health Network. ACCESS provides high quality comprehensive primary and preventive care to underserved communities in the Chicago area. Under Ms. Thompson's leadership, ACCESS has become one of the largest federally qualified health centers in the country.

**Janis Sunderhaus, MS, RN, NEA-BC, (Panelist):** is Chief Executive Officer at Health Partners of Western Ohio (Health Partners) an organization that operates eight Federally Qualified Health Center sites in Northwestern Ohio. She has been instrumental in developing an integrated approach to care which includes offering primary medical, dental, behavioral health, substance abuse treatment, vision, and clinical and dispensing pharmacy services to over 48,000 low-income residents, where advanced practice nurses lead 30/33 clinical teams. Prior to the establishment of Health Partners, Janis was a community outreach nurse to a low-income community and received multiple awards for her work. **Moderator and Facilitator: Maryjoan D. Ladden PhD, RN, FAAN.** Dr. Ladden, an Alum of the RWJF ENF 2004 cohort, was a Senior Program Officer at the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation from 2008 to 2019. There she developed and launched several nursing and multi-sector leadership programs, including Nurse Faculty Scholars, Future of Nursing Scholars, and Culture of Health Leaders. Prior to RWJF, she

was Assistant Professor at Harvard Medical School and a pediatric nurse practitioner, researcher, and Director of Continuing Professional Education at Harvard Pilgrim Health Care.

**Sheila Davis DNP, RN (Panelist):** is Chief Executive Officer of Partners in Health (PIH), a non-profit social justice organization that brings the benefits of modern medical science to the poorest and sickest communities around the world, working to ensure that the universal human right to quality health care is realized. Dr. Davis has a long history of serving the poor and marginalized, working closely with patients suffering from HIV in the 1980s, both in the U.S. and abroad. For the past decade, she has held multiple cross-site roles at Partners in Health, including Chief of Clinical Operations and Chief Nursing Officer. **Sharon Tucker PhD, APRN-CNS, NC-BC, EBP-C, FNAP, FAAN, (Panelist):** is the Grayce Sills Endowed Professor in Psychiatric-Mental Health Nursing, and Director of the, DNP Nurse Executive Track; she is the Director of Translational/Implementation Research Core, Helene Fuld Health Trust National Institute for EBP at the Ohio State University. Dr. Barksdale's research program focuses on psychological and physical stress, coping, and cardiovascular responses in African Americans.

**Karen Cox, PhD, RN (Panelist)**: is President of Chamberlain University– the largest school of nursing in the United States – since 2018. Prior to that she served first as Chief Nursing Officer, then Chief Operating Officer at Children's Mercy Kansas City from 1995-2018. She was a Robert Wood Johnson Executive Nurse Fellow from 1999-2002. She is a Fellow in the American College of Healthcare Executives and is past president of the American Academy of Nursing. She is currently focused on innovative partnerships with healthcare providers to address the nursing shortage.

**Cole Edmonson, DNP, RN, (Panelist)**: is the Chief Experience and Clinical Officer for AMN Healthcare in Dallas, Texas, where he oversees clinical and credentialing, learning and research, and is responsible for clinical quality, client and clinician experience, and marketing. Dr. Cole graduated from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Executive Nurse Fellow program in 2012, has a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree from Texas Christian University, and Master and Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Oklahoma University.
